Join us for a brief tour of the history of biblical interpretation in the Catholic Church followed by an examination of the current resurgence of biblical literalism in both the Catholic Church and evangelical Protestant communities. We will focus on what is at stake theologically and socially for both Catholics and Protestants in how we read and interpret the Bible in the present day.

Charles Bobertz is Professor of New Testament and Patristics at Saint John's School of Theology-Seminary in Collegetown, Minnesota, and the undergraduate Department of Theology of the College of Saint Benedict and Saint John's University in St. Joseph and Collegetown, Minnesota. He received his B.A. from Saint John's University and his M.T.S. from Harvard University. He received M.A., M.Phil., and Ph.D. degrees (New Testament and Early Christianity) from Yale University in 1986, 1987, and 1988. He co-edited, with David Brakke, Readings in Christian Communities: Essays on Interpretation in the Early Church, published in 2002.

In addition to his teaching responsibilities, Deacon Bobertz serves St. Hubert's Catholic Community in Chanhassen, MN.
